FY 2009 Community Outcome Targets Status Report

The committee reviewed the document at length with the following changes:

ITEM	TARGET
1	<i>The infant mortality rate will not exceed 4.8 per 1,000 live births expressed as three year rolling averages.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009. The target has been met. The committee decided to wait one more year to see if the numbers hold before changing the target.
2	<i>The low birth weight births will not exceed 6.5%.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
3	<i>91% of all pregnant women will enter prenatal care during the first trimester of pregnancy.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
4	<i>80% of teen mothers will enter prenatal care during the first trimester of pregnancy.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
5	<i>The birth rate for mothers aged 10-14 will not exceed 1.0 expressed as a three-year rolling average.</i> CHANGES: Changed to a 3-year rolling average, target remained the same
	<i>The birth rate for mothers aged 15-17 will not exceed 14.0 expressed as a three-year rolling average.</i> CHANGES: Changed to a 3-year rolling average, target remained the same
6	<i>The repeat teen birth percentage will not exceed 12.0% expressed as a three-year rolling average</i> CHANGES: Changed to a 3-year rolling average, target remained the same
7	<i>97.5% of all children will be fully immunized at kindergarten entry.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
8	<i>The rate of reported new AIDS cases will not exceed 16.0 per 100,000 persons.</i> Need to check data with the Health Department. The data does not coincide with the target. If the data is consistent with the target, the committee wants to set the rate at 4.0. CHANGES:
9	<i>The rate of reported HIV cases will not exceed 13.6 per 100,000 persons.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.

10	<i>The youth alcohol offense rate will not exceed 1.0 per 1,000 youth aged 10 - 17.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
11	<i>90% of middle school youth will report not using alcohol within the past 30 days.</i> CHANGES: Data for 2005 is not available.
	<i>60% of high school youth will report not using alcohol within the past 30 days.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
12	<i>95% of middle school youth will report not engaging in binge drinking within the past two weeks.</i> CHANGES: Data for 2005 is not available.
	<i>85% of high school youth will report not engaging in binge drinking within the past two weeks.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
13	<i>97% of middle school youth will report not being drunk or high at school within the past 12 months.</i> CHANGES: Data for 2005 is not available.
	<i>95% of high school youth will report not being drunk or high at school within the past 12 months.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
14	<i>97% of middle school youth will report not using marijuana within the past 30 days.</i> CHANGES: Data for 2005 is not available.
	<i>90% of high school youth will report not using marijuana within the past 30 days.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
15	<i>The youth drug felony rate will not exceed 2.0 per 1,000 youth aged 10-17.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009. The target has been met. The committee decided to wait one more year to see if the numbers hold before changing the target.
16	<i>The DUI arrest rate will not exceed 325 per 100,000 adults.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
17	<i>85% of all students will graduate from high school.</i> CHANGES: The Superintendent's target is 86%. Once the referendum is done, the committee will revisit this target.
18	<i>The high school attendance percentage will be at least 90.0%.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
19	<i>The high school drop out percentage will not exceed 2.8% for all students.</i> CHANGES: No changes, carry 2008 outcome target forward to 2009.
20	<i>The in-school suspension percentage for middle school students will be maintained at not more than</i> CHANGES: Revisit this measure after meeting with the Superintendent.
	<i>The out-of-school suspension percentage for middle school students will be reduced to 7.5%.</i> CHANGES: Revisit this measure after meeting with the Superintendent.
21	<i>The in-school suspension percentage for high school students will be reduced to 1.5%.</i> CHANGES: Revisit this measure after meeting with the Superintendent.
	<i>The out-of school suspension percentage for high school students will be reduced to 3.5%.</i> CHANGES: Revisit this measure after meeting with the Superintendent.
22	<i>The juvenile delinquency rate will be reduced to 75 per 1,000 youth aged 10-17.</i> CHANGES: The data does not coincide with the target - revisit after more research If the data is consistent with the target, the committee wants to set the rate at 50.
23	<i>The number of youth registered to vote by age 20 will increase by 40% (from 6,851 to 9,600).</i> CHANGES: The committee may want to change this target to the percentage of persons who actually vote.
24	<i>50% of high school youth will be engaged in community service.</i> CHANGES: The committee wants to hear from Friendship Volunteer Center on what data they gather.

The committee also reviewed the handout provided by Catherine Clouse that included all of the measures and data gathered in the Youth Risk Behavior Survey, 2004-05.

Next Meeting
