Karen welcomed the members. Minutes of the May 16, 2007 meeting were reviewed and approved.

Benchmarks for Child Well-being

Karen went over the information made available by the Florida Children and Youth Cabinet regarding "Florida Performs: Benchmarks for Child Well-being." It was submitted for the consideration of the POWG in the development of their annual community outcome measures. Kate noted that some of the information contained in this report is also in the SCOPE report and in the current Community Outcome Targets. The information in this report is not available by county. The committee concluded that this would be a good report to pull each year as a double check of annual data. However, they did not feel there was anything in the report that needed to be added to the Sarasota outcome targets at this time. It was suggested that everyone take time to review the document for discussion at the August meeting.

Review of CTC Survey Results – Overall and by School

As a result of the Middle School CTC Survey results, the data points for 2007 were added to the spreadsheets. The POWG reviewed the five targets that were affected (as follows). No changes were made to the 2011 outcome targets for 2012.

Concern was expressed by the committee that the outcome targets for 2011 significantly differed from the results of the survey and are continuing to trend in the wrong direction. They decided, however, to bring forward the existing targets for 2012 and highlight to the funders that these issues are not being adequately addressed in our community. Of particular concern are the current economic times in Florida and the nation that is hindering our ability to effectively respond to these trends.

- School rewards for prosocial involvement significantly increased for both 6th and 8th grades in 2007. It was noted that this may be as a result of the new Where Everybody Belongs (WEB) program that pairs 6th graders with 8th grade mentors for the first days of school.
